The Power of Learning Through Imitation



"This module explores early imitation, an important aspect of children's social-emotional development. The sequence of narrated slides with embedded video examples takes 20 minutes to complete. A discussion guide is provided, along with an activity sheet, and all materials are in English and Spanish."

Where Do a Baby's Personality Traits Come From?

"Although children will certainly pick up qualities from mom and dad, a new study finds the traits that will define an infant's behavior start forming at birth. A team from the United States and Germany say neural connections in the brain which determine a baby's unique behavioral traits are already active and working from the day they're born."

Effective Communication About the Early Years

"This series of articles is intended to help support infant-toddler professionals in their communications efforts."

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Problem Solvers

"Problem Solvers is a free, play-based early math curriculum for children aged 2 ½ to 4 years old. It includes 22 early math activities, 22 specially-composed songs to support each activity, and 22 read-aloud suggestions that embed early math learning into literacy experiences. Each unit also includes a parent resource (English/Spanish) suggesting at-home math play ideas."

This family-friendly resource from Colorín Colorado shares How to Support Your Child's Social-Emotional Health, a printable tip sheet, in 16 languages.

Celebrating Children's Identities to Advance Equity and Inclusion

"Children and families with multiple identities may experience increased discrimination and bias. Biases such as racism and ableism (i.e., discrimination against people with disabilities) can lead to prejudice and unfair treatment of children and families who have these intersecting identities. They can also impact who has — and importantly, who does not have — equitable access to high-quality, inclusive early learning experiences. This set of resources offers ways to read about, look at, and try out practices that promote and affirm individual differences."

Encourage Play to Stimulate Growth & Development
