

State Budget Planning Begins for FY23

The state of Delaware is moving into the budget planning for fiscal year 2023. Recently, Jamie Schneider, deaeyc's Board President and owner of the <u>Early Enrichment Center</u>, in Wilmington, DE, presented to the <u>Office of Management and Budget</u> urging for increased funding to the early childhood field:

"Funding to the POC program must be increased to the federal recommendation. The current market rate only covers a fraction of the actual cost of care and does not consider the 30-40% increase in provider costs throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, nor does it consider the impact of the much-needed minimum wage increase. Those factors, paired with an already broken system of determining the reimbursement rate, make this the critical time to prioritize equity, opportunity, and access for children and families."
