April 7, 2022 opened with a motivating <u>message</u> from Representative Lisa Blunt Rochester supporting the day's events.

Over 150 advocates joined in the sessions, which included "What Do Delawareans Think? A Conversation about Polling and Focus Groups Results," a panel discussion entitled, "Priorities in Early Education in Delaware and Nationally," and meetings with seven (7) state legislatures.

Rodel's blog post, "Delawareans Share Their Vision for Child Care on Advocacy Day," summarizes the effort: "Advocates are requesting at least \$40 million more in sustained state dollars starting in Fiscal Year 2023, which would help cover basic needs and increased costs for providers."

Early Childhood Advocacy Day takes place, officially, once a year; however, efforts like these can be made at any time. Talk about the issues, <u>contact your legislator</u>, stay connected with <u>deaeyc</u>, and <u>get involved</u>. Your voice is the key to making positive changes in legislation for early child care!




